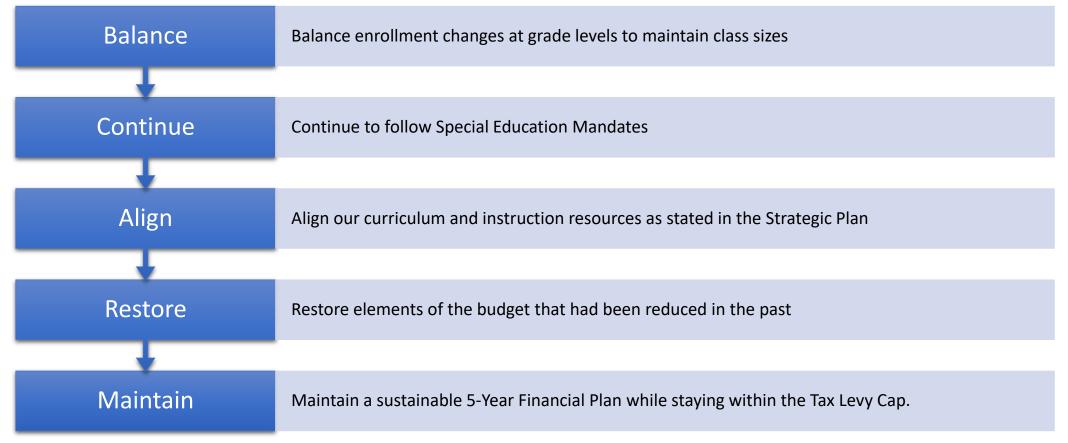

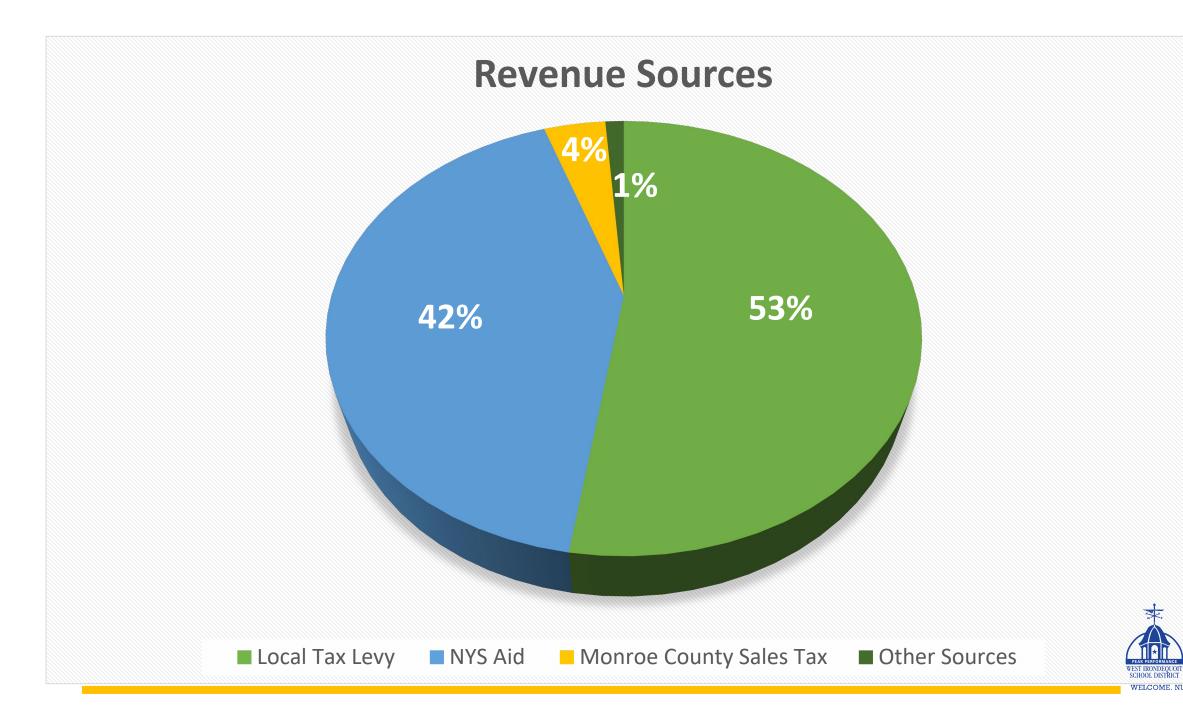

TAX LEVY CAP





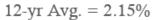

FOUNDATION AID INCREASES

- 2020-21 = \$16,313,345 (62% of full amount)
- 2021-22 = \$19,333,855 (69% of full amount)
- 2022-23 = \$24,196,613 (86% of full amount)
- 2023-24 = \$29,468,109 (est. 100% of full amount) Projected Spring 2022.
- 2023-24 = \$32,670,404 Governor's Budget Feb 1, 2023(\$3,202,295 Increase)

Resolved Campaign for Fiscal Equity lawsuit by addressing "adequacy"

Consolidated 17 categories of aid into a single unrestricted aid category

Based on enrollment, wealth, regional cost, and local effort

- 2000 census poverty numbers
- 3 year average of Free and Reduced Numbers
- Sparsity and ELL

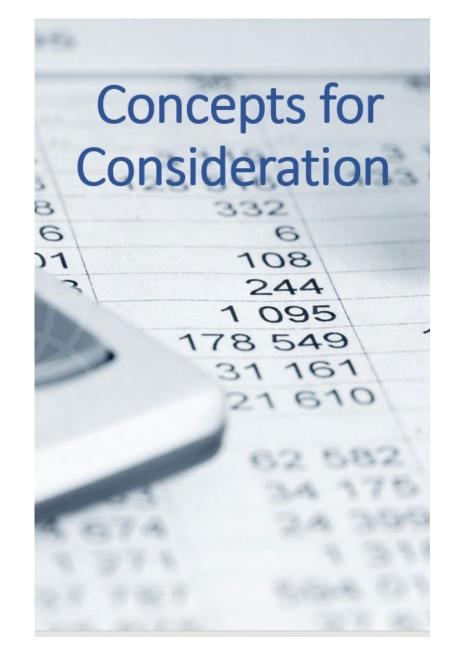
